MVL-TC Symposium Subcommittee Meeting Minutes

November 9, 2020

Miyazaki, Japan (Hybrid)

The meeting began at 12:00

1. Welcome – The Chair welcomed everyone to the meeting. He outlined the agenda.
2. Reports
 - a. ISMVL-2019 – G. Dueck reported on last year's symposium. The number of paper submissions was 61, and 38 papers were accepted. There were 54 + 4 paid attendees (4 single day registrations).
 - b. ISMVL-2020 – Y. Hata reported on the current symposium. There are 84 registrations (onsite: 27, online: 57). The number of paper submissions was 80, and 52 papers were accepted.
 - c. ULSIWS-2020 – M. Natsui reported on this year's workshop. The date of the workshop was changed from the day before ISMVL into the day after ISMVL. The workshop will be held on Nov. 11, 2020. There are 3 student posters and 6 regular talks.
3. Future Events
 - a. ISMVL-2021 – M. Lukac reported that the 51st symposium will be held on May 25 to 27 in Nur-sultan, Kazakhstan as approved at the 2019 Plenary Session. M. Lukac will serve as Symposium Chair, and S. Nagayama will serve as Program Chair. M. Lukac is planning a PhD forum for young researchers. He noted that the location of the symposium will be at a hotel or university in downtown of Nur-sultan. We discussed the style of the symposium, and decided to hold the symposium in fully virtual since it will be easier to collect papers for the virtual symposium.
 - b. ULSI-2021, RM-2021 – Y. Yuminaka proposed a joint workshop to collect papers on a wider area not related multiple-valued logic. The workshop will collect 1-page abstract papers and provide 10-min presentations on-line. The proposal was well received.

4. Site Proposal for ISMVL-2022 – M. Thornton presented a proposal to host ISMVL-2022 in Dallas, Texas, USA. He noted that IEEE ISCAS will be held in Austin, Texas, USA. He is thinking Southern Methodist University as the symposium venue. M. Thornton will serve as Symposium Chair, K. Smith will serve as Program Chair, and D. MacFarlane will serve as Local/Publicity Chair. The proposal was very well received.

5. There being no other business, the meeting concluded at 12:40.
